Golden-cheeked Warbler
(Dendroica chrysoparia)

Habitat: A mixture of mature Ashe juniper, oak, and other hardwood trees.

Body size falls between 4.5 and 5 inches, with a wingspan of 8 inches.

Warblers eat spiders, caterpillars, and other insects found on the leaves and bark of oaks and other trees.

Use long strips of cedar bark and spider webs to build their nests.

Listed as endangered on December 27, 1990.
